FALL 2001 ENROLLMENT SURVEY REPORT

Fall opening enrollment (E1) data for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is usually the 10th day. Historically, the census data have provided a "snapshot" of fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons and are used for comparison to fall enrollment data in postsecondary institutions nationwide. However, the diversities of the community college system and its students are not fully captured in these opening enrollment data. The expansion in module and late-starting classes along with the colleges' efforts to provide flexibility in scheduling from year to year increases the difficulty in reporting and comparing fall data. Enrollment trend data are best captured through the use of annual enrollment data.

Based on preliminary counts, headcount remained relatively unchanged while FTE increased slightly for fall 2001. The number of students enrolled in credit courses at community colleges as of the end of registration for fall term 2001 was 339,956, a decrease of 145 students (-0.0%) from the fall term of 2000. The total fall 2001 FTE enrollment was 183,308, an increase of 4,400 (+ 2,5%) from 2000. Preliminary counts are based on the Fall Enrollment Survey and are subject to verification upon receipt of fall enrollment (E1) data.

Table 1 contains comparative fall census enrollments for the last five years. The previous year the Illinois Community College System had experienced relative stability in headcount enrollments, following a year of slight growth. The growth in FTE enrollments over the last year was preceded by three years of decrease.

Figure 1. Opening Fall Headcount and FTE Enrollment, 1995-1999

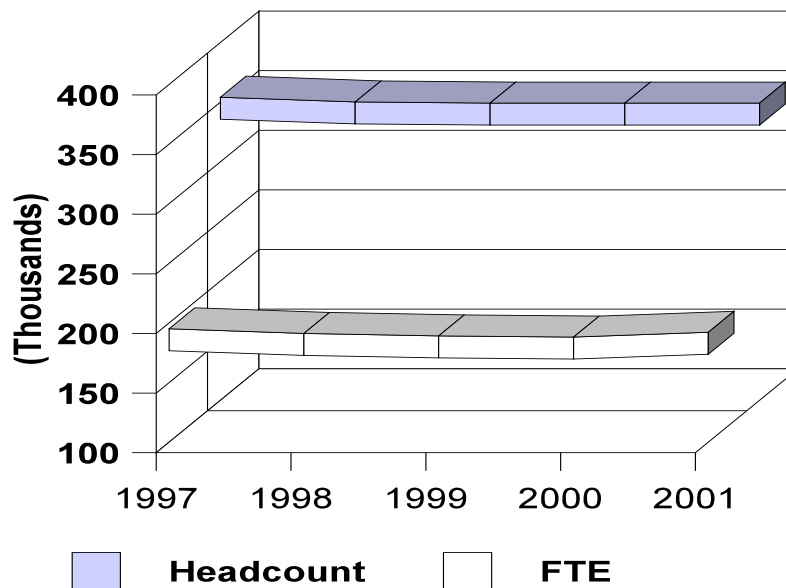


Table 2 provides a comparison of fall 1997 through fall 2001 headcount enrollments for each community college. Of the 48 community colleges, 23 colleges experienced increases in headcount, while 19 exhibited decreases during the past year. Six colleges experienced little or no change (less than one percent) over the last year. Table 3 contains a comparison of FTE enrollments for the five-year period. FTE increases were reported by 33 colleges, decreases by 13, and two colleges indicated little or no change.

Table 4 provides a comparison of 2000 and 2001 fall headcount, for each community college, broken out into correctional and non-correctional enrollments. Table 5 shows a comparison of FTE enrollments, both correctional and non-correctional, for fall 2000 and fall 2001 at each community college.

Twelve Illinois community colleges extended instructional services to correctional institutions in the fall semesters of 2000 and 2001. Correctional headcounts accounted for 1.1 percent of the statewide headcount and correctional FTE accounted for 0.9 percent of the overall FTE in fall 2001. These proportions are similar to correctional enrollments reported for fall 2000. An examination of only correctional enrollments reveals that headcount increased an estimated 7.9 percent, while FTE increased about 13.8 percent.

Headcount enrollments that were exclusively non-correctional decreased 0.1 percent from fall 2000 to fall 2001, comparable to the overall headcount decrease of 0.04 percent. The overall FTE increase of 2.5 percent was comparable to the increase of 2.3 percent in non-correctional FTE enrollment.
