

# ILLINOIS COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD

## FALL 2004 ENROLLMENT SURVEY REPORT

Fall opening enrollment (E1) data for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is usually the 10th day. Historically, the census data have provided a "snapshot" of fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons and are used for comparison to fall enrollment data in postsecondary institutions nationwide. However, the diversities of the community college system and its students are not fully captured in these opening enrollment data. The expansion in module and late-starting classes along with the colleges' efforts to provide flexibility in scheduling from year to year, increases the difficulty in reporting and comparing fall data. Enrollment trend data are best captured through the use of annual enrollment data.

Overall, preliminary statewide community college opening Fall 2004 enrollment numbers were essentially unchanged from the previous year (less than one percent difference). Based on preliminary counts, there was a small decrease in headcount for Fall 2004. The number of students enrolled in credit courses at Illinois community colleges as of the end of registration for Fall term 2004 was 362,771, a small decrease of 2,248 students (-0.6%) from the Fall of 2003. Preliminary data for Fall 2004 also show a minimal increase in FTE enrollment. The total system wide Fall 2004 FTE enrollment was 202,980, a slight increase of 281 (+0.1%) from 2003. Preliminary counts are drawn from an internet based Fall Enrollment Survey and are subject to verification upon receipt of college Fall Enrollment (E1) data submissions.

Table 1 contains comparative fall census enrollments for the last five years. This year's small statewide decrease in headcount is the first decrease in three years. The slight system wide FTE increase for this year marks the fourth consecutive year of FTE enrollment growth over the past five years.

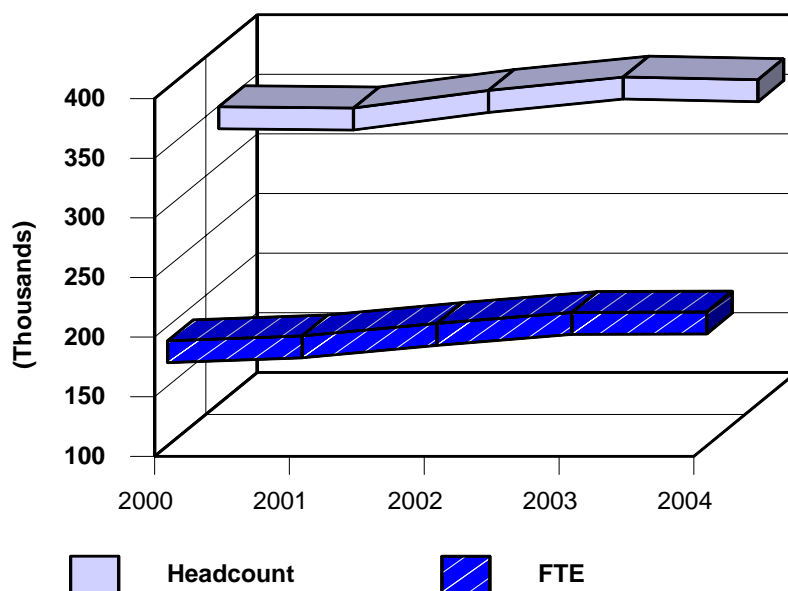


Figure 1. Opening Fall Headcount and FTE Enrollment, 2000-2004

Table 2 provides a comparison of fall 2000 through fall 2004 headcount enrollments for each community college. Of the 48 community colleges, 21 colleges experienced increases in headcount (one percent or more). Twenty colleges exhibited decreases during the past year, and an additional seven colleges experienced little or no change (less than one percent) over the last year. Table 3 contains a comparison of FTE enrollments for the five-year period. Over the past year, FTE increases were reported by 22 colleges, decreases by 15, and 11 colleges indicated little or no change.

Table 4 provides a comparison of 2003 and 2004 fall headcount for each community college, broken out into correctional and non-correctional enrollments. Table 5 shows a comparison of FTE enrollments, both correctional and non-correctional, for fall 2003 and fall 2004 at each community college.

Ten Illinois community colleges extended instructional services to correctional institutions in the fall semester of both 2003 and 2004. Correctional headcounts accounted for 1.3 percent of the statewide headcount. This proportion is slightly higher than that reported in fall 2003. Correctional FTE accounted for 0.6 percent of the overall FTE in fall 2004 – slightly lower than the proportion reported last year. An examination of only correctional enrollments reveals that headcount increased 35.2 percent, while FTE decreased 10.5 percent at correctional institutions. Headcount enrollments that were exclusively non-correctional decreased 0.9 percent from fall 2003 to fall 2004. The overall FTE increase of 0.1 percent was virtually identical to the increase of non-correctional FTE enrollment.
