FALL 2007 OPENING ENROLLMENT SURVEY RESULTS

Statewide Results. Overall, statewide Illinois Community College System opening Fall 2007 enrollments were similar to last fall. These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. Systemwide, Fall 2007 enrollments showed a small decrease in headcount (-0.8 percent) and a small increase in the number of Full-time Equivalents (FTE + 0.3 percent) compared to last year. Statewide, slightly fewer students were attending a community college but those who did enroll took slightly more credits.

The number of students enrolled in credit courses at Illinois community colleges as of the end of regular registration for Fall 2007 was 347,599 or -2,909 fewer than last fall. Statewide FTE enrollment was 197,540 which is up the equivalent of 672 full-time students from Fall 2006. These preliminary counts are from the internet based Fall 2007 Enrollment Survey and results are subject to verification upon receipt of the detailed Fall Enrollment (E1) data submission.

Table 1 provides systemwide comparative fall census enrollment counts for the last five years. Statewide opening headcount enrollments decreased slightly for the fourth consecutive year. This year's slight statewide FTE enrollment increase marks the first time in two years the FTE enrollment has grown. Current opening fall statewide FTE is similar to the corresponding Fall 2005 FTE.

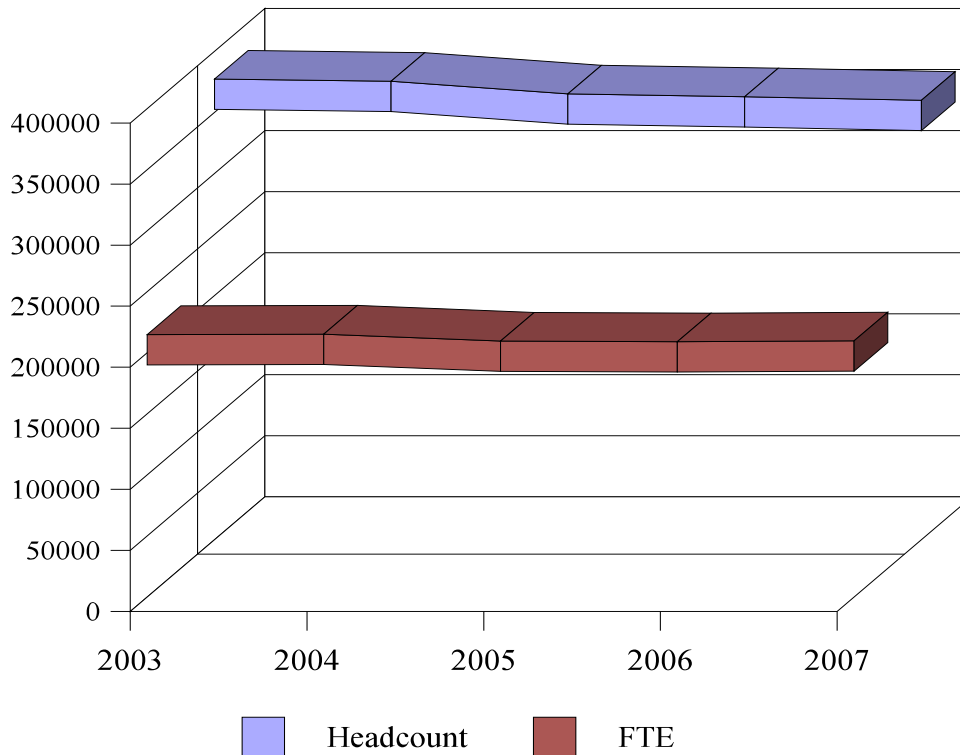


Figure 1: Opening Fall Headcount and FTE Enrollment, 2003-2007

Results by College. Table 2 provides comparative information by college of Fall 2003 through 2007 headcount enrollments. A one-year comparison between Fall 2006 and Fall 2007 among the 48 community colleges shows that twenty-three colleges reported headcount decreases of one percent or more. Nineteen colleges exhibited headcount enrollment increases of one percent or above. The remaining six colleges experienced little or no change (less than one percent).

Table 3 provides a college level comparative data on FTE enrollments for the most recent five-year period. The number of colleges with FTE enrollment increases lead those who reported FTE declines. Over the past year, FTE increases were reported by 23 colleges, decreases by 18, and seven colleges registered little or no change.

Results for Students in Correctional Facilities. Table 4 provides a comparison of 2006 and 2007 fall headcount enrollment for each community college, broken out by correctional and non-correctional student enrollment. Table 5 shows a comparison of FTE enrollment – correctional and non-correctional students – for Fall 2006 and Fall 2007 by community college. Ten Illinois community colleges furnished instructional services to correctional facilities during the Fall semester of both 2006 and 2007. In the latest data, there were 3,039 students in correctional facilities which accounts for 0.9 percent of the statewide headcount. Proportionately, this was slightly lower than in Fall 2006 (1.2 percent). Students in correctional

facilities accounted for 1.0 percent (1,880) of the overall FTE enrollment in Fall 2007 which is similar to Fall 2006 (0.9 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities reveals a headcount decrease of -26.2 percent (-1,078) and FTE increase of 7.3 percent (128 FTE). Exclusively non-correctional headcount enrollment decreased slightly (-0.5 percent) from Fall 2006 to Fall 2007. The non-correctional FTE enrollments increased slightly (0.3 percent).

Additional Background. Fall opening enrollment information for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is typically the 10th day of class. Opening fall enrollment data are gathered from postsecondary institutions nationwide. Historically, these counts provide a "snapshot" of opening fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons. The diversity of the community college system and its students is not fully captured in these opening enrollment data. Colleges actively seek out opportunities to serve students that may not fit into the traditional reporting framework. Modules within terms/late-start classes and internet based course delivery are some examples of college outreach efforts. Providing increasingly flexible scheduling from one year to the next is necessary to accommodate student schedules and compete successfully in the marketplace. Hence, enrollment trends are more fully captured through use of annual data.
