FALL 2009 OPENING ENROLLMENT SURVEY RESULTS

SYSTEMWIDE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENTS ARE AT AN ALL TIME HIGH
HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENTS REGISTER HIGHEST LEVELS IN OVER A QUARTER OF A CENTURY

Statewide Results. Overall, statewide Illinois Community College System opening Fall 2009 enrollments are up substantially compared to last fall. These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. Systemwide, Fall 2009 enrollments show a substantial increase in both headcount (+ 6.4 percent) and Full-time Equivalent (FTE + 9.5 percent) enrollments compared to last year. Statewide, compared to last fall, more students were attending community colleges and those attending are taking more credit hours/courses.

The number of students enrolled in credit courses at Illinois community colleges as of the end of regular registration for Fall 2009 was 380,025 or 22,868 more than last fall. Statewide FTE enrollment was 223,353 which is up the equivalent of 19,287 full-time students from Fall 2008. These preliminary counts are from the internet based Fall 2009 Enrollment Survey. Results are verified as the detailed Fall Enrollment (E1) data submissions are finalized.

Table 1 provides systemwide comparative fall census enrollment counts for the last five years. Statewide opening fall headcount enrollments are at a twenty-seven year high. The early 1980s recession (1981 and 1982) were the only years when fall headcount enrollments were higher across the Illinois community college system. Remarkably, current opening fall statewide FTE is at an all time high since fall FTE reporting began in 1965.




Figure 1: Opening Fall Headcount and FTE Enrollment, 2005-2009

Results by College. Table 2 provides information on colleges with more than a ten percent increase in headcount enrollment. In Fall 2009 nineteen colleges had double digit increases in headcount enrollments. The externally attached Table 4 provides comparative information by college for Fall 2005 through 2009 headcount enrollments. A one-year comparison between Fall 2008 and Fall 2009 among the 48 community colleges shows that forty colleges exhibited headcount enrollment increases of one percent or above. Seven colleges reported headcount decreases of one percent or more. The remaining college experienced little or no change (less than one percent). Colleges with headcount enrollment gains outnumbered those with losses by more than 5 to 1.

Table 3 provides information on colleges with more than a ten percent increase in FTE enrollment. In Fall 2009 twenty-five colleges had double digit increases in FTE enrollments. The externally attached Table 5 provides college level comparative data on FTE enrollments for the most recent five-year period. Remarkably, for every college reporting an FTE decline there were eleven colleges who reported an FTE increase. Over the past year, FTE decreases were reported by 4 colleges and increased were posted by 44 colleges.

Students in Correctional Facilities. Twelve Illinois community colleges furnished instructional services to correctional facilities during the Fall semester of both 2008 and 2009. The externally attached Table 6 provides a comparison of correctional and non-correctional 2008 and 2009 Fall headcount enrollment for each community college. In the latest data, there were 2,752 students in correctional facilities which accounts for 0.7 percent of the statewide headcount. Proportionately this was lower than Fall 2008 (0.9 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities reveals a headcount decrease of -16.3 percent (N = -537). Conversely, non-correctional headcount enrollment increased (+6.6 percent N = +23,405) from Fall 2008 to Fall 2009.

The externally attached Table 7 shows a comparison of FTE enrollment – correctional and non-correctional students – for Fall 2008 and Fall 2009 by community college. Students in correctional facilities accounted for 0.7 percent (N = 1,547) of the overall FTE enrollment in Fall 2009 which is proportionately slightly lower than Fall 2008 (0.8 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities shows that incarcerated student FTE was similar to last year (+0.8 percent or N = +13 FTE) but did not keep up with the enrollment gains in non-correctional population enrollments (+9.5 percent or N = +19,274 FTE).

Internet Enrollment by College. Internet enrollments are an important part of enrollment growth in the community college system. Fall 2009 is the second year that internet enrollments have been reported from all colleges in the Opening Fall Enrollment Survey. The externally attached Tables 8 and 9 provide duplicated and unduplicated headcount internet enrollment for Fall 2009 and Fall 2008. There were 83,124 duplicated internet enrollments and 54,851 unduplicated internet enrollments for Fall 2009. Duplicated internet headcount enrollments jumped 22.5 percent from Fall 2008 while unduplicated internet enrollments surged 20.0 percent. Based on unduplicated beginning of term counts, in Fall 2009 internet headcount enrollments (unduplicated) accounted for 14.4 percent of overall headcount enrollments which is an increase from 12.8 percent in Fall 2008.

Table 10 provides opening internet FTE enrollment for Fall 2009. There were 17,013 internet FTE enrollments. This is an increase of 18.7 percent from Fall 2008. In Fall 2009, internet FTE enrollments accounted for 7.6 percent of overall opening FTE enrollments, an increase from 7.0 in Fall 2008.

Additional Background. Fall opening enrollment information for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is typically the 10th day of class. Opening fall enrollment data are gathered from postsecondary institutions nationwide. Historically, these counts provide a "snapshot" of opening fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons. The diversity of the community college system and its students is not fully captured in these opening enrollment data. Colleges actively seek out opportunities to serve students that may not fit into the traditional reporting framework. Modules within terms/late-start classes and internet based course delivery are some examples of college outreach efforts. Providing increasingly flexible scheduling from one year to the next is necessary to accommodate student schedules and compete successfully in the marketplace. Hence, enrollment trends are more fully captured through use of annual data.
