FALL 2010 OPENING ENROLLMENT SURVEY RESULTS

SYSTEMWIDE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENTS ARE AT AN ALL TIME HIGH
HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENTS ARE DOWN SLIGHTLY FROM LAST YEAR – 2010 HEADCOUNT
ENROLLMENTS ARE AT THE 2ND HIGHEST LEVEL IN OVER A QUARTER OF A CENTURY

Statewide Results. Opening Fall 2010 enrollments reflect a strong demand for the courses and programs that Illinois community colleges provide. Systemwide in Fall 2010, one measure of enrollment set a new record with 224,803 Full-time Equivalent (FTE) students enrolled. Headcount enrollments for Fall 2010 are 378,578 which is a small decrease compared to last year. The number of individuals receiving a community college education (headcount) remains at the second highest level in over a quarter of a century.

At 224,803, statewide FTE enrollment is up the equivalent of 853 full-time students (FTE +0.4 percent) from Fall 2009. Community colleges serve many part-time students. FTE figures reflect the total number of credit hours being taken by students divided by 15 – the number of semester hours traditionally considered a full-time class load. The number of students enrolling in credit courses at Illinois community colleges as of the end of regular registration for Fall 2010 was 378,578 or 4,837 fewer (-1.3 percent) than in Fall 2009. Statewide, compared to last fall, fewer students are attending community colleges but those attending are taking more courses.

These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. These preliminary counts are from the internet based Fall 2010 Enrollment Survey. Results are verified as the detailed Fall Enrollment (E1) data submissions are finalized.

Table 1 provides systemwide comparative fall census enrollment counts for the last five years. Statewide opening fall headcount enrollments are the second highest in twenty-seven years. During Fall 2009 and the early 1980s recession (1981 and 1982) were the only years when fall headcount enrollments were higher across the Illinois community college system. Remarkably, current opening fall statewide FTE is at an all time high since fall FTE reporting began in 1965.




Figure 1: Opening Fall Headcount and FTE Enrollment, 2006-2010

Results by College. Table 2 identifies the seven colleges with more than a five percent increase in headcount enrollment for Fall 2010 compared to last year. The externally attached Table 4 provides comparative information by college for Fall 2006 through 2010 headcount enrollments. A one-year comparison between Fall 2009 and Fall 2010 among the 48 community colleges shows that nineteen colleges exhibited headcount enrollment increases of one percent or above. Twenty-two colleges reported headcount decreases of one percent or more. The remaining seven college experienced little or no change (less than one percent).

Table 3 lists the nine colleges reporting more than a five percent increase in FTE enrollment for Fall 2010 versus last fall. The externally attached Table 5 provides college level comparative data on FTE enrollments for the most recent five-year period. Over the past year, FTE increases were posted by 23 colleges and 17 colleges reported decreases. Eight colleges experienced little or no change in FTE.

Students in Correctional Facilities. Nine Illinois community colleges furnished instructional services to correctional facilities during the Fall semester of both 2009 and 2010. The externally attached Table 6 provides a comparison of correctional and non-correctional 2009 and 2010 Fall headcount enrollment for each community college. In the latest data, there were 2,526 students in correctional facilities which accounts for 0.7 percent of the statewide headcount. Proportionately this was the same as Fall 2009. An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities reveals a headcount decrease of -8.2 percent (N = -226). **Non**-correctional headcount enrollment decreased (-1.2 percent N = -4,611) from Fall 2009 to Fall 2010.

The externally attached Table 7 shows a comparison of FTE enrollment – correctional and non-correctional students – for Fall 2009 and Fall 2010 by community college. Students in correctional facilities accounted for 0.5 percent (N = 1,210) of the overall FTE enrollment in Fall 2010 which is proportionately lower than Fall 2009 (0.7 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities shows that incarcerated student FTE was much lower than last year (-21.8 percent or N = -337 FTE) and did not keep up with the enrollment gains in **non**-correctional population enrollments (+0.5 percent or N = +1,189 FTE).

Internet Enrollment by College. Internet enrollments are an important part of enrollment growth in the community college system. Fall 2010 is the third year that internet enrollments have been reported from all colleges in the Opening Fall Enrollment Survey. The externally attached Tables 8 and 9 provide duplicated and unduplicated headcount internet enrollment for Fall 2008 through Fall 2010. There were 93,361 duplicated internet enrollments and 61,034 unduplicated internet enrollments for Fall 2010. Duplicated internet headcount enrollments jumped 12.3 percent from Fall 2009 while unduplicated internet enrollments increased 11.3 percent. Based on unduplicated beginning of term counts, in Fall 2010 internet headcount enrollments (unduplicated) accounted for 16.1 percent of overall headcount enrollments which is an increase from 14.3 percent in Fall 2009.

Table 10 provides opening internet FTE enrollments for Fall 2008 through Fall 2010. There were 18,902 internet FTE enrollments in Fall 2010. This is an increase of 11.1 percent from Fall 2009. In Fall 2010, internet FTE enrollments accounted for 8.4 percent of overall opening FTE enrollments, an increase from 7.6 in Fall 2009.

Additional Background. Fall opening enrollment information for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is typically the 10th day of class. Opening fall enrollment data are gathered from postsecondary institutions nationwide. Historically, these counts provide a "snapshot" of opening fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons. The diversity of the community college system and its students is not fully captured in these opening enrollment snapshot data. Community college flexible scheduling (e.g., modules, other intensive late start classes, etc.) is necessary to accommodate student schedules and compete successfully in the marketplace. Hence, enrollment trends are more fully captured through use of annual data.
