## FALL 2015 OPENING ENROLLMENT SURVEY RESULTS

**Statewide Results.** Overall, Illinois Community College System opening Fall 2015 enrollments are down compared to last fall. These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. Fall 2015 enrollments show a decrease in headcount (-5.6 percent) and a decrease in the number of Full-time Equivalent enrollments (-5.2 percent) compared to last year. The Illinois Community College System experienced record-level Fall enrollments in recent years with peak headcount enrollment in Fall 2009.

Systemwide, 317,192 students enrolled at Illinois Community Colleges in credit coursework in Fall 2015. The number of students enrolling in credit courses at Illinois community colleges as of the end of regular registration for Fall 2015 is 18,910 less than in Fall 2014.


Table 1 provides system wide comparative fall census enrollment counts for the last five years as well as 2001 and 2006. Statewide opening headcount enrollments and Full-time Equivalent (FTE) enrollments decreased for the fifth consecutive year. Prior to the student population spike in Fall 2009, the Fall 2008 headcount enrollments were at 357,157 while Fall 2008 FTE enrollments were at 204,066. Fall 2015 headcount enrollments have decreased 9.5 percent since Fall 2006 and 6.4 percent since Fall 2001. Fall FTE enrollments are at their lowest level since Fall 2001 (N = 183,024). Fall 2015 FTE enrollments have decreased 6.3 percent from Fall 2006 but increased 0.8 percent from Fall 2001.

In an effort to gain more insight on causes for enrollment decline in most community college districts a question was added this year's survey. Nearly two-thirds of the colleges (N = 30) identified the recovering economy as having a strong impact on the enrollment decline at their institutions, while one-third of the colleges (N = 16) said it had a moderate impact on the enrollment decline. Only two institutions said the economic cycle had no impact. About half of the colleges listed financial aid (N = 24), college affordability (N = 24), the state budget (N = 23), and/or the shift in overall district population (N = 22) as having a moderate impact on the enrollment decline. The out-migration of students in the district was cited as having a moderate impact (N = 20) or no impact (N = 21) on the enrollment decline.

Community colleges educate and train many part-time students. FTE figures reflect the total number of credit hours being taken by students divided by 15, which is the number of semester hours traditionally considered a full-time class load. The FTE enrollment was 184,437 in Fall 2015. Statewide FTE enrollments are down the equivalent of 10,048 full-time students (FTE -5.2 percent) from Fall 2014.

These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. These preliminary counts are from the web-based Fall 2015 Enrollment Survey. Results are verified as the detailed Fall Enrollment (E1) data submissions are finalized.

**Results by College.** The externally attached Table 2 provides comparative information by college for Fall 2011 through 2015 headcount enrollments. A one-year comparison between Fall 2014 and Fall 2015 among the 48 community colleges shows that there are nearly six colleges with enrollment decreases for every college that reported an enrollment gain. Thirty-four colleges reported headcount decreases of one percent or more. Six colleges exhibited headcount enrollment increases of one percent or above. The remaining eight colleges experienced little or no change (less than one percent).

The externally attached Table 3 provides college level comparative data on FTE enrollments for the most recent five-year period. Over the past year, FTE decreases are posted by 37 colleges, and 5 colleges reported increases. Six colleges experienced little or no change in FTE.

**Students in Correctional Facilities.** Three Illinois community colleges furnished instructional services to correctional facilities during the Fall semester of both 2014 and 2015. The externally attached Table 4 provides a comparison of correctional and non-correctional 2014 and 2015 Fall headcount enrollment for each community college. In the latest data, there are 748 students in correctional facilities, which accounts for 0.2 percent of the statewide headcount. Proportionately this was similar to Fall 2014. An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities reveals a headcount decrease of 44.3 percent (N = -596). **Non**-correctional headcount enrollment decreased (-5.5 percent, N = -18,314) from Fall 2014 to Fall 2015.

The externally attached Table 5 shows a comparison of FTE enrollment – correctional and non-correctional students – for Fall 2014 and Fall 2015 by community college. Students in correctional facilities accounted for 0.1 percent (N = 275) of the overall FTE enrollment in Fall 2015 which is proportionately similar to Fall 2014 (0.2 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities shows that incarcerated student FTE decreased from last year (-37.5 percent or N = -165 FTE), while the enrollment declined in **non**-correctional population enrollments (-5.1 percent or N = -9,883 FTE).

**Online Enrollment by College.** Online instruction is an important part of the delivery of instructional programs in the community college system. Fall 2015 is the eighth year that online enrollments have been reported from all colleges in the Opening Fall Enrollment Survey. The externally attached Tables 6 and 7 provide unduplicated and duplicated headcount online enrollment for Fall 2011 through Fall 2015. There are 96,058 duplicated online enrollments and 60,892 unduplicated online enrollments for Fall 2015. Duplicated online headcount enrollments increased 2.9 percent (+2,720) from Fall 2014. However, Fall 2015 unduplicated online enrollments decreased 6.6 percent with 4,305 fewer students than Fall 2014. Based on unduplicated beginning of term counts, in Fall 2015 online headcount enrollments (unduplicated) accounted for 19.2 percent of overall headcount enrollments which is a slight decrease from last year (19.4

percent).

Table 8 provides opening online FTE enrollments for Fall 2011 through Fall 2015. There are 19,290 online FTE enrollments in Fall 2015, which is a slight decrease over Fall 2014 (-0.6 percent or -122 FTE). In Fall 2015, online FTE enrollments accounted for 10.5 percent of overall opening FTE enrollments, which is a slight increase from Fall 2014 (10.0 percent).

The Fall 2015 online unduplicated headcount is 2.1 percent below its corresponding 5-year average (N = 62,171). The Fall 2015 online duplicated headcount is above its 5-year average (+1.3 percent; N = 94,826). The online FTE for Fall 2015 is slightly below its 5-year average (N = 19,309).

**Additional Background.** Fall opening enrollment information for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is typically the 10th day of class. Opening fall enrollment data are gathered from postsecondary institutions nationwide. Historically, these counts provide a "snapshot" of opening fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons. The diversity of the community college system and its students is not fully captured in these opening enrollment snapshot data. Community college flexible scheduling (e.g., modules, other intensive late start classes, etc.) is necessary to accommodate student schedules and compete successfully in the marketplace. Hence, enrollment trends are more fully captured through use of annual data.
