## FISCAL YEAR 2002 SPRING ENROLLMENT REPORT

Each Spring, community colleges report their opening spring term enrollment figures to the Illinois Community College Board on a brief spring enrollment survey. These figures reflect only those students enrolled in credit courses that were operational on the census date (last day for course registration for regular classes). Enrollment for classes beginning after the census date are reflected in the annual enrollment counts. The following report summarizes the survey results.

## INFORMATION ONLY

Background. This report contains information on student enrollments as of the end of registration (usually the 10th day of the term) for the spring semester and for the winter quarter at the College of DuPage, the one district on the quarter system. Results of the fiscal year 2002 survey show that both headcount enrollments and full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments increased statewide compared with the same term one year ago. The spring semester headcount was 344,296 compared to 328,538 (an increase of 15,758 or 4.8 percent) last year. FTE was 179,718 compared with 168,841 a year ago (an increase of 10,877 or 6.4 percent).

After experiencing virtually no change last year, spring headcount enrollments registered a substantial increase this year. FTE enrollments also registered a relatively large increase this year following a slight decrease last year.

Table 1 contains comparative spring tenth-day enrollments for the last five years. Fiscal year 2002 spring headcount totals and FTE enrollments are at the highest levels in the past five years and reflect the greatest increase in the same time frame. Figure 1 on the next page illustrates a comparison of headcount and FTE trends from 1998-2002.

Table 2 provides a comparison of fiscal year 1997 through fiscalyear 2001 spring headcount enrollments for each community college. Of the 48 community colleges, 38 colleges experienced increases in headcount, while 8 exhibited decreases during the past year. Two colleges experienced little or no change (less than 1.0 percent) over the last year. Table 3 contains a comparison of FTE enrollments for the fiveyear period. FTE increases were reported by 38 colleges, decreases by 8 , and 2 colleges indicated little or no change.
