FY17 Provider Manual Updates

Three entirely new sections:

Section 3- WIOA (defines purpose of WIOA, mandatory LWIB and One-Stop Participation);

Section 8- High School Equivalency (three different testing options with the specifics for each exam, all forms included to administer an HSE exam and request access to GED manager);

Section 15- Appendix (acronyms and definitions for WIOA, WIOA joint rules, and EDGAR).

FY17 Provider Manual

Important updates from the other sections:

Section 2- Area Planning Council (APC Bylaws Template and Area Planning Council Statue amendment);

Section 4- General Fiscal Policies (Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IEL/CE) replaces El/Civics funding; GATA requirements; Unallowable costs; Time Distribution Sheets must be maintained for all staff paid with grant funds);

Section 5- Student Intake (Students are required to enter into a Career Pathways program; Sample Consent to Obtain High School Equivalency Form);

Section 6- Assessment (One-Stop Center Report);

Section 7- Instruction (Programs are required to incorporate <u>career pathways</u>, <u>Illinois Adult Education</u> <u>Content Standards through the use of Standards Proficient Instruction</u>, and <u>digital literacy</u> into the instructional process);

Important updates from the other sections:

Section 9- Student Support Services (Additional support services and strategies for programs that involve the other required partners of WIOA);

Section 10- Professional Development (Programs are strongly encouraged to develop specialists in the areas of assessment, math, Language Arts, ESL/ELA, Special Learning Needs, and transitions to serve on program instructional teams);

Section 11- National Reporting System (New definitions for periods of participation for students for NRS reporting purposes; Definitions for the Measureable Skill Gain Indicators programs will be held accountable to under WIOA);

Section 12- Reporting and Records (New due dates for End of Year reports, Data Verification, Certification of Units report and Fiscal reports; Signed certifications of accuracy must accompany all voucher payments, annual reporting, and final fiscal reporting statements; EDGAR Guidelines for Retention updated; Consortium guidelines; Six required WIOA measures of effectiveness);

Section 13- Program Monitoring (National Reporting System FY2017 Illinois Targets);

Section 14- Audit Requirements (Providers must have either a Single Audit for recipients of \$750,000 or more in Federal awards or a Yellow-Book audit for recipients of Federal awards under \$750,000. Providers that receive any state awards must also submit a State Grant Compliance Audit. Submission of the Certified Annual Financial Report (CAFR) cannot be substituted for the State Grant Compliance Audit or Single Audit/Yellow Book).
