





'THE FUTURE OF NURSING REPORT SET AN **AMBITIOUS GOAL: 80% OF PRACTICING RNS SHOULD** BE PREPARED WITH A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (BSN) OR MORE ADVANCED DEGREE BY 2020. IT ALSO CITED EVIDENCE TO SUPPORT THE CALL FOR MORE HIGHLY EDUCATED NURSES^{1,2} AND SUBSEQUENT STUDIES HAVE LINKED HIGHER NURSE **EDUCATION TO IMPROVED PATIENT OUTCOMES.**3"

"THE EMERGENCE OF BACCALAUREATE NURSING PROGRAMS AT COMMUNITY **COLLEGES UNDERSCORES THE NATIONAL NEED FOR MORE PROGRAMS TO RAISE** THE EDUCATION LEVEL OF THE NURSING **WORKFORCE. THESE PROGRAMS VALIDATE** THAT NURSES WITH ASSOCIATE AND BACCALAUREATE DEGREES ARE NOT **EQUALLY PREPARED FOR PRACTICE AND** HAVE DISTINCT COMPETENCIES.
