

## FALL 2018 OPENING ENROLLMENT SURVEY RESULTS

**Statewide Results.** Consistent with national community college enrollment trends, the Illinois Community College System opening Fall 2018 overall enrollment is down compared to the previous year. Illinois Community College System Fall 2018 enrollments show a decrease in headcount (-3.8 percent) and a decrease in the number of Full-time Equivalent (FTE) enrollments (-4.3 percent) compared to last year. These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. The Illinois public university overall undergraduate FTE is showing a decline as well in Fall 2018 at -1.8 percent as described in the [Illinois Board of Higher Education Fall Enrollment Report](#).

Systemwide, 282,180 students enrolled at Illinois Community Colleges in credit coursework in Fall 2018. The number of students enrolling in credit courses at Illinois community colleges as of the end of regular registration for Fall 2018 is 11,237 fewer than in Fall 2017.


Table 1 provides system-wide comparative fall census enrollment counts for the last five years as well as 2001 and 2006. The Illinois Community College System experienced record-level Fall enrollments in recent years with peak headcount enrollment during the Great Recession. Statewide opening headcount enrollments and Full-time Equivalent enrollments have continued to decrease since that time (eight consecutive years). Fall 2018 headcount enrollments have decreased 19.5 percent since Fall 2006 and 16.8 percent since Fall 2001. Fall 2018 FTE enrollments have decreased 17.2 percent from Fall 2006 and decreased 10.9 percent from Fall 2001.

While fall enrollments have declined in recent years, the numbers of graduates in the Illinois Community College System have increased considerably since 2001 and 2006. A total of 63,446 completions occurred in 2018 compared to 38,420 in 2001 and 49,627 in 2006.

Community colleges educate and train many part-time students. FTE figures reflect the total number of credit hours being taken by students divided by 15, which is the number of semester hours traditionally considered a full-time class load. The FTE enrollment was 163,041 in Fall 2018. Statewide FTE enrollments are down the equivalent of 7,262 full-time students (FTE -4.3 percent) from Fall 2017.

These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. These preliminary counts are from the web-based Fall 2018 Enrollment Survey. Results are verified as the detailed Fall Enrollment (E1) data submissions are finalized.

**Results by College.** Table 2 provides comparative information by college for Fall 2014 through 2018 headcount enrollments. A one-year comparison between Fall 2017 and Fall 2018 among the 48 community colleges shows that there are nearly four colleges with enrollment decreases for every college that reported an enrollment gain. Thirty-five colleges reported headcount decreases of one percent or more. Nine colleges exhibited headcount enrollment increases of one percent or above. The remaining four colleges experienced little or no change (less than one percent).

Table 3 provides college level comparative data on FTE enrollments for the most recent five-year period. Over the past year, FTE decreases are posted by 41 colleges, and five colleges reported increases. Two colleges experienced little or no change in FTE.

**Students in Correctional Facilities.** Two Illinois community colleges furnished instructional services to correctional facilities during the Fall semester of both 2017 and 2018. Table 4 provides a comparison of correctional and non-correctional 2017 and 2018 Fall headcount enrollment for each community college. In the latest data, there are 167 students in correctional

facilities, which accounts for 0.1 percent of the statewide headcount. Proportionately this was similar to Fall 2017 (0.0 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities reveals a headcount increase of 17.6 percent ( $N = +25$ ). Non-correctional headcount enrollment decreased (-3.8 percent,  $N = -11,262$ ) from Fall 2017 to Fall 2018.

Table 5 shows a comparison of FTE enrollment—correctional and non-correctional students—for Fall 2017 and Fall 2018 by community college. Students in correctional facilities accounted for 0.1 percent ( $N = 110$ ) of the overall FTE enrollment in Fall 2018 which is proportionately similar to Fall 2017 (0.0 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities shows that incarcerated student FTE increased from last year (+80.9 percent or  $N = +49$  FTE), while the enrollment declined in non-correctional population enrollments (-4.3 percent or  $N = -7,311$  FTE).

**Online Enrollment by College.** Online instruction is an important part of the delivery of instructional programs in the community college system. Fall 2018 is the eleventh year that online enrollments have been reported from all colleges in the Opening Fall Enrollment Survey. Tables 6 and 7 provide unduplicated and duplicated headcount online enrollment for Fall 2014 through Fall 2018. There are 104,102 duplicated online enrollments and 65,423 unduplicated online enrollments for Fall 2018. Duplicated online headcount enrollments increased 5.0 percent (+4,983) from Fall 2017, while Fall 2018 unduplicated online enrollments increased 4.0 percent with 2,520 more students than Fall 2017. Based on unduplicated beginning of term counts, in Fall 2018 online headcount enrollments (unduplicated) accounted for 23.2 percent of overall headcount enrollments which is an increase from last year (21.4 percent).

Table 8 provides opening online FTE enrollments for Fall 2014 through Fall 2018. There are 20,434 online FTE enrollments in Fall 2018, which is an increase over Fall 2017 (3.0 percent or +594 FTE). In Fall 2018, online FTE enrollments accounted for 12.5 percent of overall opening FTE enrollments, which is an increase from Fall 2017 (11.6 percent).

The Fall 2018 online unduplicated headcount is 2.9 percent above its corresponding 5-year average ( $N = 63,572$ ). The Fall 2018 online duplicated headcount is also above its 5-year average (+5.3 percent;  $N = 98,863$ ). The online FTE for Fall 2018 is above its 5-year average (+4.0 percent;  $N = 19,652$ ).

**Additional Background.** Fall opening enrollment information for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is typically the 10th day of class. Opening fall enrollment data are gathered from postsecondary institutions nationwide. Historically, these counts provide a "snapshot" of opening fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons. The diversity of the community college system and its students is not fully captured in these opening enrollment snapshot data. Community college flexible scheduling (e.g., modules, other intensive late start classes, etc.) is necessary to accommodate student schedules and compete successfully in the marketplace. Hence, enrollment trends are more fully captured through use of annual data. More complete data regarding full-time/part-time status, demographics, and programs of study are collected via ICCB's Centralized Data System and available via [ICCB's Data Book](#).
