Illinois Community College Board Complete College America Context Metric 2: Completion Ratio

Complete College America (CCA), established in 2009, is a national nonprofit that aims to increase the graduation number and rate of college students. Illinois was in the first group of states to join the initiative and be part of the CCA Alliance of States (<u>http://www.completecollege.org/</u>). To advance higher education graduation rates, CCA officials developed a series of metrics identified under three categories: **Progress** (PM), **Outcomes** (OM), and **Context** (CM). Generally, each metric has subsets including full-time/part-time status, race/ethnicity, gender, age groups, remedial status at entry, and Pell recipient status. ICCB generates the entire set of metrics for the state and each community college using

agency longitudinal data systems.


Context Metric 2. Completion Ratio. measures the annual ratio of undergraduate degrees and certificates awarded 100 full-time per equivalent (FTE) students the state level. at disaggregated bv race/ethnicity, gender, and degree type. Annual FTE is the number of credit hours divided by 30 which reflects the enrollment student intensity а attending on a full-time

basis would need to earn to stay on track to finish an associate degree in two years.

In fiscal year 2014 Illinois community colleges awarded **31.6 degrees and certificates for every 100 full-time equivalent (FTE)** undergraduate students. The completion ratio was **18.9 for degrees and certificates of one year or more awarded**.



The overall completion ratio has increased in fiscal year 2014 from 30.1 in fiscal year 2013 and 24.4 in fiscal year 2009. The ratio including only degrees and certificates of one year or more in fiscal year 2014 has increased from 17.8 in fiscal year 2013 and 14.9 in fiscal year 2009.

Nationally, in fiscal year 2013, two-year public institutions awarded a total of 1,066,997 degrees and certificates (NCES, Table 301.10, Digest of Education Statistics, 2014), while the FTE was 3,904,873 (NCES, Table 307.10, Digest of Education Statistics, 2014), which results in a completion ratio of 27.3 percent for two-year public institutions in fiscal year 2013.

Comparative information with other participating states has not been made available for this metric by CCA.
