Illinois Community College Board Complete College America Progress Metric 5: Retention Rates – Part-Time Students

Complete College America (CCA), established in 2009, is a national nonprofit that aims to increase the graduation number and rate of college students. Illinois was in the first group of states to join the initiative and be part of the CCA Alliance of States (http://www.completecollege.org/). To advance higher education graduation rates, CCA officials developed a series of metrics identified under three categories: Progress (PM), Outcomes (OM), and Context (CM). Generally, each metric has subsets including full-time/part-time status, race/ethnicity, gender, age groups, remedial status at entry, and Pell recipient status. ICCB generates the entire set of metrics for the state and each community college using agency longitudinal data systems.

Progress Metric 5, Retention Rates, measures the number and percentage of entering degree or certificate-seeking under-graduate students enrolling consecutively from fallto-spring and from fall-to-fall at the same higher education institution. PM5 is available by enrollment status.

More than half of first-time part-time students in Fall 2010 were retained, transferred, or graduated in Spring 2011 (N = 10,273/16,586 or 61.9 percent). Forty-eight percent (N = 7.923; or 47.8 percent) were retained, transferred, or graduated in Fall 2011. For each consecutive Fall semester through Fall 2013, more than one in four students were retained, transferred, or graduated: Fall 2012 (47.8 percent) and Fall 2013 (41.5 percent).




Fig. 1. Retention Rates of Part-Time Students at Illinois Community Colleges, FY 2008-2011

Reporting of the retention rates in the second Spring semester and subsequent Spring semesters became optional in the 2015 CCA collection (Fall 2009/FY 2010 cohort). ICCB did not report these optional rates.

When comparing the FY10 and FY11 cohorts, the number of part-time students who were retained, transferred, or graduated by the Fall term in the fourth year after entry increased 17.1 percent (+981). The proportion of these students increased 4.2 percent.
