he Pipeline for the Advancement of the Healthcare Workforce Program (PATH) is an annual, non-competitive grant, of which all community colleges in the state of Illinois receives funds. The purpose of the PATH grant is to create, support, and expand the opportunities of individuals in the nursing pathway and select healthcare pathways to obtain credentials and degrees that allow them to enter and/or advance their careers in the healthcare industry. Additionally, this grant aims to address the shortage of workers in the healthcare industry that have been exasperated by the COVID 19 pandemic.

Message From The Executive Director

Welcome Back!

The semester is well underway and we are starting to tally enrollment at the state level, though colleges are of course watching enrollment numbers daily. Although the ICCB doesn't have official numbers yet, conversations point to significant increases, with some colleges potentially seeing double digits. Anecdotally, reports suggest that dual credit enrollment is up, students transferring into the college have increased and enrollment growth is continuing. One area of significant growth is adult education, where we expect even more. During the FY23 academic year, Illinois' Adult Education and Literacy programs saw a 35 percent increase in student enrollment, reaching over 52,000 learners. This follows the 40 percent increase of student state level, in adult education, ICCB's adult education digital marketing campaign did much to move the needle we believe. Across the system, the Illinois Community College Marketing Collaborative is poised to create similar results.

This speaks to normalization in the system. It also speaks to the tremendous efforts that this system has put forth to bring students back post pandemic. We have seen the continued embrace of multiple delivery methods—hyflex, online (synchronous and asynchronous), CBE, traditional, accelerated, etc., all of which create opportunities for the many and varied students the system serves. At the ICCB we look forward to supporting you this year as you continue to innovate, explore and expand successful instructional and support strategies, and otherwise continue to change lives in your communities. The ICCB will provide approximately \$9.194 million in grant funding opportunities to be administered to support innovative bridge and transition programs.


The purpose of this grant is to:

- · create programs that promote equity and diversity among those served; and/or

What made you decide to seek a new career? "This is the first career I am pursuing, and I could not be more excited to enter a career I have such a passion and enthusiasm for."

Why did you choose the career program/community college that you

did? "I knew I wanted to attend a physical therapist assistant program while in high school. This was due to my firsthand experiences as a patient and spending years in physical therapy to walk and regain my mobility. I want to be able to give back to others, improve their lives, and help them achieve their goals like so many physical therapists did for me. My focus and goal were finding the right program for me. My mom found this program online and told me about it. I did some research and investigated it, I wanted to know more about it. I met the advisor, and after speaking with her, I knew this was the program I wanted to attend. The program has so many things in place to help students succeed. There are a lot of extra resources here that I was not finding in other local programs I was looking into. When I went in for orientation and met the faculty it confirmed I made the right decision in attending this program. Everyone was so welcoming and friendly and genuinely wanted to see all of us succeed."

"I am so grateful for this program and the PATH grant. This program requires a lot of time and dedication, and I gave this program my all. Due to spending a lot of time in the program I only worked one to two days a week, which of course added to the stereotypical "broke college student." The PATH Grant helped take off some of the financial stress and allowed some ease of mind knowing I was getting some financial help. I am also thankful for this program who equipped my classmates and I with the tools and skills to be a successful clinician. The program provided us knowledgeable professors that brought real world experience into the classroom. They also provided a variety of clinical experiences that pushed me and expanded my knowledge to be the best clinician I can be. There is a CARE program at this school for healthcare career students which is set up to monitor students' academic success. If needed CARE program staff can create learning plans to help students get back on track if someone has a challenging time grasping concepts or for whatever extra help that might be required to be successful. There is a dedicated PTA tutor that is there to help in any aspect a student might need both with academic work and hands-on skills. I am grateful to have been able to attend and benefit from the different resources the school provided to help me achieve my goals."
